## Fostering Classroom Community

Play, Learn Grow... Tgether!

I am a strong believer of responsive classroom management within the classroom. I believe in working with students to understand the natural consequences for their actions and focusing on dignity rather than shame. Students are included in the conversation to ensure that they can evaluate their behaviors and make the best choices. I value connection, reflection, communication, honesty and compassion in my classroom leadership and culture.

Our classroom rules are simply: Be kind, be safe, and try your best. Students are also taught that "We are friends." Therefore, friends support and encourage one another during play and other class activities. Our preschoolers are taught that they were made by God to glorify Him. Our curriculum is playbased allowing children to problem solve and think for themselves as they pursue answers to

their questions. By fostering curiosity, we guide them along their learning journey-each child setting their own pace.



#### SEPARATION ANXIETY

The first few weeks can be difficult for some students and families. It can be a big adjustment. It is not unusual for children to love school one day and then not want to go the next. I want you to know that we will do everything to support your child and create an environment where they feel safe, happy and loved.

Here are some tips for getting through the first few days:

Try to act confident yourself. If you seem anxious and unsure about leaving your child, your child will pick up on your emotions and start wondering if there really is something to worry about!

Be consistent with goodbyes. We will greet your child and you can give kisses and say goodbye. We promise to welcome your child and help ease him/her into the classroom.

Make sure to say good-bye when you leave.

Trying to "sneak out" when the child is busy and not looking sometimes makes the child panic a few minutes later, and may make separation even more difficult the next day.

Separation problem sometimes show up on the second or third day. Stay consistent with your goodbye routine, and make your connection at pick-up time especially long and attentive.

#### Family Photos

In the first week of preschool and beyond, it is important that children are able to begin making connections between their home and preschooll. This helps to encourage each child to gain a sense of belonging within this new community. It also helps them to feel safe and settled. We kindly ask you to send in a family photo that we can display in the classroom, so that children can be reassured by the familiar faces and feel more at home in this new space.





#### Drop off/Pick Up

For preschool, we require that you walk your child to the preschool/kindergarten playground to drop them off. To ensure safety, wait until a member of staff arrives. If your child will be coming by bus, please inform us and we will organize to collect them. This helps to keep everyone in the preschool at the preschool safe and accounted for at all times around the campus. For dismissal teachers will bring your child at elementary field just near the playground near where parents pack their cars.

If you have questions or concerns that require time and privacy, please make an appointment, so that I can give you my full attention.

### LEARNING CAN GET MESSY

In preschool, we learn through hands on activities and lots of play, both which are often messy and mucky. With this in mind please send your child in clothing that are comfortable. Also, please send in a spare change of clothes (including spare underwear). These will be kept at school for emergencies. These clothes should be in a labelled bag.



## SHOES

At Preschool, we change in and out of shoes many times a day. Please send your child in shoes that they can confidently manage on their own. This means they should be able to put them on in less than one minute, with no assistance. Easy inside shoes such as slippers are also useful for use inside the classroom, especially during rainy seasons, although bare foot or socks are fine too.
